# Introduction

Want to do some origami but don't have any paper? Why not use money that you may already have to make things? There are plenty of things you can make with that money in your wallet. In this example we will make a portrait frame out of your money. We will be using a one dollar bill, but you can use any. If you have a wallet sized or smaller photo you can even slip that in instead of have the default president portrait. These can be made anytime your bored, or wish to leave an annoying tip for waiters or waitresses, whenever fun times are had!

## Step One:

Lay your dollar out flat face up. Fold the edge of the sides in to the center.

You can decide for yourself how big you wish to frame the picture, the following picture should give you a good idea what to do.



## Step Two:

Fold in the top and bottom of the dollar towards the center on the top of the bill like so. I provided two views to get a clearer picture.



### Step Three

Fold the edges back leaving just the portrait and the frame on the front of the side like pictured. You are now done with the portrait dollar bill!

Optional: fold the top edge of the folds in to better hide the stand supports.
